The American contingent did not wait long to do business, Fred Seitz of Brookdale Farm acting as agent buying a filly by **Champs Elysees**, **Lot 29**, for €70,000 from Ronald Rauscher, as agent. Seitz followed up with a sharp colt by **Excellent Art** from Gestüt Görlsdorf for €36,000, **Lot 37**, named **Baltic Art.**

American agent Mike McMahon of McMahon and Hill stepped up on that when paying €180,000 for Lot 56, from Gestüt Fährhof, on behalf of Vivien Malloy of Edition Farm, based in Hyde Park, New York. The athletic Cape Cross filly is the third foal out of Goathemala (Black Sam Bellamy), the winner of the Gr.3 EBF Stutenpreis and Groupplaced twice, and already the dam of Goiania (Oasis Dream), second in the Listed Youngster Cup at two in 2013. Under the third dam sit the Group winners Global Dream and Global Thrill, and under the fourth the Champions and sires Fame And Glory (Montjeu) and Farhh (Pivotal). Mrs Malloy commented: "*I have been trying to buy a filly in Germany for much of the year. I tried privately and off the race track, but things didn't work out, but now I have one.*"
